

Road Cycling around Burrillville And Northwestern Rhode Island

For a **leisurely morning of sightseeing by bicycle**, try the back roads between Wallum Lake, Bridgeton, Pascoag and Harrisville. The old stone barn still exists on Stone Barn Road, and the pastoral scenery in this area is boundless.

The experts on the subject of bicycling statewide, the Narragansett Bay Wheelmen (NBW), suggest several cycling tours in and around the Northwestern corner of the state. Here are three that all begin at **Burrillville High School**:

NBW Ride #10: *Tri-State Tour*, a 20, 25 or 34 mile ride that visits country roads, scenic woodlands, lakes, and historic mills and mill towns.

NBW Ride #11: *The 'Ville' Ride* is a ride of 20 or 30 miles that passes open waterways and waterfalls.

NBW Ride #12: *The Super Simple Arrowless Amble* is a simple, and fascinating 12 or 25 mile ride through Harrisville, into Douglas and Uxbridge, which returns by way of **Wright's Farm Restaurant** for Family Style chicken – an all you can eat meal.
